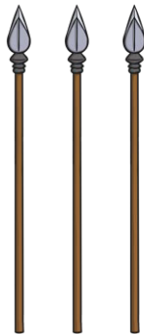


Numeracy and Maths

- Create a Venn Diagram of modern tools, Stone Age tools and tools that were created during the Stone Age that we still use today.
- People in the Stone Age used marks when they were counting. Can you count how many toys or books you have and use tally marks to record this?



Out and About

- Use natural materials to create a picture of the Stone Age.
- Create types of paint by crushing berries, grass, leaves and other natural materials. Use the paint to make a picture.



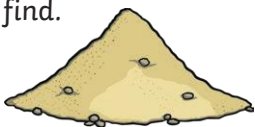
Literacy and English

- List all the jobs that people had to do during the Stone Age. Can you list at least ten jobs?
- Create an acrostic poem using the word 'Stone Age'.



Working with Others

- Create a Stone Age quiz to test your friends and family. Who can get the best score?
- Imagine you are an archaeologist. Place small objects in sand, soil or rice and ask someone to find them using a small brush (like a toothbrush or make up brush) or teaspoon. Ask someone to hide objects for you to find.



Stone Age Projects Year 3

Expressive Arts

- Use your body language, posture, sounds and words to act like a person from the Stone Age.
- Draw a picture of what your cave would look like if you lived in the Stone Age.



Technologies

- Using a variety of materials, create a small model of a Stone Age dwelling or monument, such as Stonehenge.
- Imagine you can go back in time to the Stone Age. You can take one piece of modern technology. What would you take and why?



Health and Wellbeing

- Create a Stone Age recipe, think of ingredients that were available during that time.
- Hunter-gatherers needed to use spears to catch animals and rocks to knock fruit out of trees. In a safe space, practise throwing sticks and balls just like the hunter-gatherers.



Social Studies

- Draw and list animals that existed during the Stone Age.
- Create a poster with your ten favourite Stone Age facts and present it to the class.





Stone Age Craft Ideas



Cave Paintings

Stone Age people painted pictures on cave walls. These pictures depicted everyday scenes like hunting and cooking. Try painting a scene on a stone and then varnishing it. Use sticks, feathers or your fingers instead of a paintbrush.



Flint Knapping

Stone Age people used to shape flint with a stone and then use it to make spear and arrowheads, as well as tools. This process is known as knapping. Use a clay tool to create your own spearhead from soap.



Fabric Dyeing

Stone Age people used natural dyes like berries, and charcoal to colour the material they wove. Use a piece of white cotton to experiment with different natural dyes.



Homes

Stone Age Mesolithic people built shelters to live in. Use canes or sticks to create a teepee shape and fix them together at the top with string. Then cover the shelter with fabric to make it weatherproof. Stone Age people would have used animal skins or turf to cover their shelters.



Stonehenge

Why not make your own model of Stonehenge using playdough, building bricks or boxes?



Hand Stencils

Work with a partner to draw around each other's hands in chalk. You might like to overlap the chalk images to create a large hand painting, like the ones found in caves in Lascaux, France.



Pottery

Stone Age people made clay pots for storing and cooking food. Try making your own pot from clay.
